#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS & INFORMATION

When do I get my advisor? Students will find out who their advisor is during MS Launch Day on Friday, August 10.

When do I get my locker? Students will receive a locker number at MS Launch Day. Lockers are school property and students will be held accountable for any damage to them. Students may use magnetics only to decorate and post appropriate pictures in their lockers. Students should not write or put decals or bumper stickers on the walls of their lockers. It is highly recommended that students set up their locker during MS Launch Day.

When do I get my schedule? Students will receive their schedules during orientation days the first week of school.

**Can I have electronic devices?** Students may not use cell phones, iwatches and/or other personal electronic devices during the school day (unless directed by a teacher for a specific assignment), specifically in any buildings between the hours of 7:30 am (half-hour before school) and 3:15 pm. The half-hour period in the morning before the start of first classes, in particular, is an important time for students to visit with classmates and/or prepare for the school day.

## MS DAILY DRESS CODE (for 2017-18): Watch for updates in the 2018-19 All School Handbook

#### **Daily Dress Code for All Students:**

• Collared shirts, blouses, dress shirts, turtlenecks, sweaters, sweatshirts

-Modest neckline/no visible cleavage -Shirts may not have writing (small logo or MICDS is acceptable)

-No athletic-type tees -Shoulders need to be covered

-No tight fitting tops -No sheer tops with visible camis or undergarments

-If sweater/sweatshirt is removed, the shirt underneath must be in dress code

- -Undershirts must be shorter than the outside shirt or sweater
- -Shirts may not have writing (small logo or MICDS is acceptable)
- Pants: khakis, corduroy, cargo, dress, capri
  - -If looped waist, a belt is needed

Note: leggings are not considered pants. If you choose to wear leggings, a proper length dress or skirt must be worn.

- Shorts: Bermuda length or longer
  - -If looped waist, a belt is needed
- Skirts, dresses to the top of the knee
- Shoes: Athletic shoes, dress shoes, and sandals with backs

**What Not to Wear:** The following are examples of dress or grooming that are not permitted – other examples may be added at a later date at the discretion of the Deans in consultation with Head of Middle School:

- Excessively tight or revealing clothing tops and bottoms
- Yoga pants/athletic wear
- Bare midriffs
- Clothes which show visible cleavage
- Visible undergarments
- Clothing made of sheer fabrics
- Clothing with frays, holes, rips, or tears (even if it is designed to look that way)
- Attire with inappropriate or offensive writing
- Athletic-type t-shirts except for Spirit Wear on Fridays
- Military-themed/camouflage/hunting clothing
- Sweat pants, distressed pants, baggy pants
- Denim (except on Fridays or designated "Special Jeans Days")
- Pajamas/slippers
- $\bullet$  Facial hair, except for religious reasons
- Hats or headgear in the buildings, except for religious reasons

**Friday Spirit Days:** Every Friday (or last day of the school week) is designated as Spirit Day in the Middle School, when the Daily Dress Code for All Students can be modified by:

- MICDS Spirit Shirts or Logo Wear
- Nice blue denim jeans

Special Dress Days: To be determined by the Head of Middle School

#### For Males:

- Dress shirts, turtlenecks
  - -Dress shirts must be tucked in
  - -No polos
- Dress pants, khakis
  - -If looped waist, a belt is needed
- Dress or athletic shoes with closed toe and heel, and socks

#### For Females:

- Nice shirts and sweaters with a modest neckline
  - -Shoulders need to be covered
  - -No visible cleavage
  - -No tight fitting tops
- Dresses/Skirts to the knee (no denim)
- Dress pants, khakis (no corduroys, cargos)
  - -If looped waist, a belt is needed
- Low heeled dress shoes/boots, athletic shoes with closed toe and closed heel

## STUDENT SUMMER WORK

#### 5th-8th gr. MATHEMATICS SUMMER WORK

We strongly encourage all of our students in fifth through eighth grades to spend a little time over the summer considering their role in creating a path to success in the next math course. Whether this is done through skills worksheets centered on recommended topics or through practice using the online math sites list below, the purpose is to refresh the understanding of concepts that are important in the next course.

The MICDS math program uses a mastery based approach that requires strong foundational knowledge of certain topics for success at each grade level. The concepts build over time, and it is important for a student to enter a course with a high level of understanding of particular topics. We have listed the most important concepts for success in the first few months of school by grade level and have included links to online practice problems for these **topics are attached.** It is also important to note that the topics listed do not encompss all required material for that grade level. Also, the topics listed should be viewed as critical for success in all subsequent grade levels. For example, an entering 7th grader should be well versed in all topics leading up to 7th grade. If the student feels additional practice on a 6th grade topic would be helpful, he or she should absolutely review this material as well.

#### 6th-8th gr. WORLD LANGUAGES

Hello new and current students! Our World Languages teachers have designed summer learning opportunities in each of our languages to help you maintain your ability level over the summer and begin the school year with confidence. You will find information on this page to help you practice fundamental skills and review familiar topics.

Please look for the course you are entering for the 2018-2019 school year and click on it to view the learning activities. Complete this review to help you achieve success early in the year and feel comfortable in your new language classes. Your teachers will either collect what you have done and provide feedback on it during the first week of school OR provide an assessment related to this work. The learning activities are designed to take approximately two hours total to complete.

Click on the link below that corresponds to the <u>level of the class you're entering</u> to access the review information for your class. Summer work is not required for 7th grade French, Latin, Mandarin, or Spanish 7, which are all level 100A courses.

#### 5th-8th gr. SUMMER READING

The English department requires each grade level to read 3 summer reading books.

We strongly recommend that the paperback novels for summer reading and for the classes throughout the year be purchased through the MICDS Bookstore. If you choose to purchase from the bookstore, it is important that you purchase the same edition. Students need to regard these books as textbooks.

We will be teaching students to annotate, take notes in the margins, and cite textual evidence. Study guides created by the teachers contain page numbers that coordinate with the edition in the bookstore.

Summer Reading assignments are due the 1st week of school.

#### 8th gr. COMMUNITY SERVICE

All eighth grade students are encouraged to devote a significant amount of time towards community service. Students are expected to complete at least twenty hours of service before the end of the school year.

Information regarding the specifics of this program, such as how students get credit for their work and what is appropriate volunteer work, is attached. 8th gr. Community Service Information sheet.

#### SCIENCE SUMMER WORK

Please click here to visit the Science Summer Work Web page. (CTRL + click mouse) Select the science course for the 2018-2019 school year from the **COURSES** drop-down menu near the top of the webpage to view more information about the REVIEW topics from the completed science course and PREVIEW science topics for the upcoming year. The Science Summer Work is required and should be completed before the first day of school. It is strongly recommended that students spend about an hour per week reviewing, practicing and experimenting with the variety of topics and vocabulary provided. There are approximately ten weeks of summer break. There will be roughly 6-8 hours of summer science work depending on the course and student pace. The Science Department recommends doing about an hour of the work each week throughout the summer, although some investigations may require some time each day over several days. Please look at the Science Summer Work assignment at the beginning of the summer to plan when the longer -term investigations and observations will fit into summer schedules.

Please follow the directions provided to receive full benefit and full credit for your work.

### TIME TO FILL OUT & UPDATE INFORMATION

#### **MEDICAL FORMS**

The 2018-19 Student Health Forms for all new and returning students are available on the Portal to be completed. Please go to the Resources section on the Portal and find the Health Forms section, download the appropriate student packet, and complete the applicable pages. Completed physicals and health forms should be mailed, faxed, or sent via email to the LS/MS Nurse.

For new families who do not have access to the portal yet, the 2018-19 Health Forms were also provided by Admissions at the time of your child's admittance. Please reach out to Admissions if you do not have the forms to meet the deadline.

ALL students must have all assigned forms complete and submitted to be eligible for school entrance or athletic practice. Any student without complete forms will be sent home from school and not allowed to participate in August practices/games (and beyond) until the required information is completed. Immunizations must be up-to-date and comply with the 2018-19 Missouri school immunization requirements. Please read each section carefully and complete all required information. Forms for ALL students are due no later than June 29, 2018.

It is MSHSAA and MICDS policy that ALL students entering grades 7 through 12 submit a doctor's physical exam performed on or after February 1, 2018. We will accept physical forms from your doctor office, as well, as long as a complete medical health history is included.

In addition, all NEW students entering grades 7 through 12 AND ALL students entering 7<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> grades will need a baseline concussion test. Instructions for returning students for this online test are included in the health form packet for 7th-12th graders.
