Steve Hall will long be remembered at MICDS where he has become their all-time career leader in rushing yards and in points scored. His name is all over the MICDS record books as a top ten season performer. Steve, a 5' 11", 205 pound running back was selected "Metro Conference Offensive Most Valuable Player" this year and has earned All-District and All-State honors for the last three years. He has achieved the honor of being an Academic All-State winner in both football and track. Steve has received offers to play at the college level from a large number of schools (Harvard, Yale, Dartmouth, Brown, Columbia, and more) and he has committed to attend Lindenwood University this fall.

Steve has been strong in the classroom. He is completing a challenging college preparatory program of study and has a 3.63 grade point average on an unweighted 4.0 scale. He co-chaired the MICDS Black Student Union and served as a camp counselor for youth footballers, while also mentoring peers at MICDS. Of note is that Steve was voted team captain in both his junior and senior years, a position traditionally held by a senior at MICDS.

Steve's head coach, Dr. Fred Bouchard, tells us of Steve's senior year, "It was clear this season that Steve was a catalyst for the synergy of our team, and he made those around him better because they could see the effort he poured into helping them get better." Coach Bouchard adds, "Steve has committed to playing at Lindenwood University for college. Playing in front of his parents as well as other family and friends was very important to Steve and he turned down no less than five Ivy leagues suiters as well as other FCS and FBS programs."

Steve's selection as a winner by the Tom Lombardo Chapter-National Football Foundation was due to the lasting striving for excellence he has demonstrated. His commitment to family and community are impressive and we are pleased to honor him.
